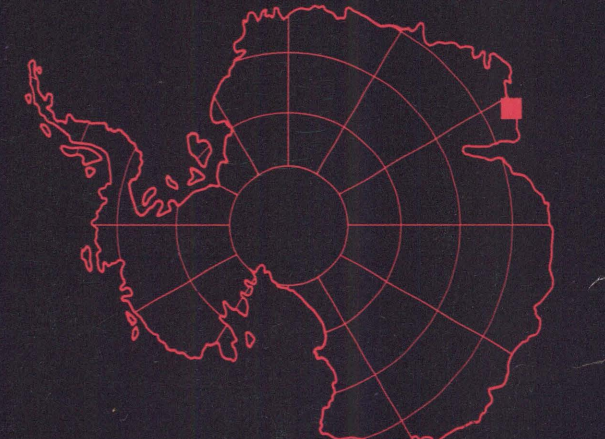


Framnes Mountains

FRAMNES MOUNTAINS

The Framnes Mountains are a group of mountains consisting of the Casey, Masson, and David Ranges, adjacent peaks and nunataks. The three major ranges and other lesser features were sighted and named in January by the BANZARE expedition under Sir Douglas Mawson in 1930. This coast was also sighted by several Norwegian whalers next season. The area was first mapped by Norwegian cartographers from aerial photographs taken by the Lars Christensen Expedition in January 1937. The area was named by Christensen after Framnesfjellet, a hill near Sandefjord, Norway.

The first landing in the area was made by Dr P. G. Law when he selected the site for the ANARE scientific station Mawson at Horseshoe Harbour in February 1954. The base station has been occupied continuously by Australia since that date.

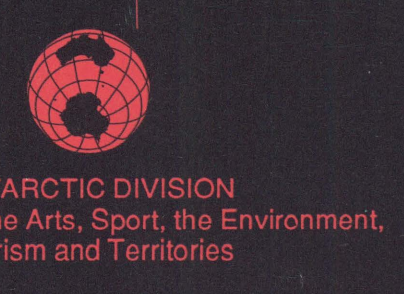
